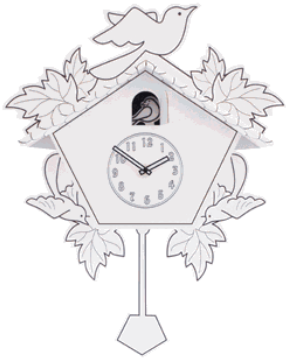


# NeXtime Reveals Its New 2010 Collection of Clocks
